### Guildford Arts 23rd Summer Exhibition The Mill Studio Theatre, 4 - 19 July 2018

**G**uildford Arts will be holding its **23rd Annual Summer Exhibition** at the **Mill Studio**, the historic Victorian building next to the **Yvonne Arnaud Theatre**.

The exhibition will showcase contemporary art from both local and national artists, with a number having exhibited at prestigious local and national exhibitions and galleries, including the *Royal Academy Summer Exhibition, Pastel Society Annual Exhibition,* and appeared in *Sky Arts' Landscape Artist of the Year* programme.



There is a wide variety of work from detailed still life to atmospheric interiors, landscapes, portraits and abstracts in various media including watercolour, pastel, acrylic and oil, to prints, etchings and photography. Three dimensional work in glass, wood and ceramics will also be exhibited.

The popular *"Meet the Artist"* event will be held each Saturday - this is a great opportunity to meet some of the artists exhibiting and find out more about their work and their techniques. In addition, several will be demonstrating their work and there will be an opportunity to buy unframed pieces.

An art quiz for younger visitors will be held during the exhibition, with drawing materials supplied.

# Guildford: a place where everyone can enjoy great arts - that's the vision of the new Arts Development and Public Art strategies.

Lead Councillor for Heritage and the Arts, Cllr Nikki Nelson-Smith, says: "We are

proud of the vibrant and varied arts scene throughout our Borough and are extremely fortunate to work with so many talented artists and organisations that make this happen.

"Our two new **Arts Development** and **Public Art Strategies** aim to harness the potential of the arts to make a genuine and meaningful impact on the lives of our residents and communities.

"Widespread public consultation, including residents, artists, community groups and people working in the arts, helped shape and direct both strategies. They give us a clear plan for the next five years. We will be able to look further ahead to increase opportunities for arts activities, partnerships and funding.

"As well as raising the profile of the arts and highlighting how they contribute to health and wellbeing, society and the economy, the strategies will also help artists and organisations to plan fundraising and projects.

*"Public art helps create unique places where people want to live, work and play. Our public art strategy identifies key opportunities and includes guidance on how to work with artists to create great public art.* 

"To deliver our strategies we have developed action plans, which we will review with stakeholders every year."

The diverse nature of the 'arts' includes performing and visual arts, combined arts, circus arts, dance, fashion and the creative industries, festivals, literature, music and theatre, together with

film, media and digital and much more!

'Public art' is the process of artists working with the local community to

develop temporary or permanent pieces of art that are either stand-alone features or integrated into the environment for everyone to enjoy. Most public art is paid for as part of the planning process, not by council tax payers.

## **Art and Nature in Perfect Harmony**

Broadleaved plants and mature trees support, frame and enhance an ever-changing



collection of contemporary sculpture in the beautiful grounds of **The Hannah Peschar Sculpture Garden**. The Sculpture Garden was the brainchild of owner and original curator Hannah Peschar some 35 years ago, and proudly exhibits over 200 pieces every summer. Newly emerging and established artists from across Britain and Europe exhibit their work in these unique surroundings, allowing their sculptures to be seen in a whole new way by a global audience.

Surrounding a 15th century listed cottage, the

gardens themselves are a work of art in their own right. Over the past 40 years the garden has been redesigned by award-winning landscape designer and Hannah's husband Anthony Paul, who has introduced a variety of broad-leaved architectural plants, new ponds and bold planting. Embracing the naturally damp environment fed by a stream flowing from the Surrey Hills, the lush garden allows visitors to believe they could have been transported to some far away land.

There are no flowering borders, no neat lines - nothing is contrived. A controlled wildness gives the Sculpture Garden a feeling of magic and wonder. Infinite shades of green, fascinating shapes and textures create a dialogue with the contemporary sculptures



The range of works selected by the curators is wide in style and materials. The placement of each sculpture explores the relationship and the resulting synergy between art and nature and is very carefully considered within the garden. The result is a combination of peaceful, intimate spaces and dramatic, surprise vistas in an ever-changing environment.

### ACM's Absolute Passion...



**H**eadquartered in Guildford. The music industry's entrepreneur Kainne Clements, owner of the legendary Metropolis Studios in Chiswick, was appointed as Executive Chairman in August 2013. ACM students can now enjoy access to all areas of Europe's largest recording complex, in which the likes of Queen, Adele, Amy Winehouse, Wil.i.am and countless others have recorded. This joining of educational and professional environments has created a unique end-to-end proposition for those wanting to pursue a career in the music and wider creative industries, not to be found anywhere else in music education.





Kainne comments that "Over the last 3 years we've more than doubled our student body and opened two new Campuses in London and Birmingham. We'll soon have close to 2,400 students studying across our three locations, but our commitment to our Guildford base has not waned. Indeed, with the recent lease of The Electric Theatre and a pledge to run it for the

people of Guildford as a community arts venue for the next 20 years, our love for Guildford has never been stronger".

## David Dragon - Master of the Graphic Arts



**D**avid Dragon, Guildford Arts member and exhibitor, began his long and varied career by landing a job as a record sleeve designer at Decca Records in 1969. The covers he designed there included artists as diverse as the decidedly uncool Reginald Dixon, organist at the Tower Ballroom, Blackpool, to the positively arctic, Rolling Stones.

Jumping ship to take up a similar role at EMI Records in the 70's, David added Cliff Richard, Glen Campbell and Neal Diamond

to his list of credits. When Punk came snarling, spitting and pogoing onto the scene in 1976, he embraced the raw energy that came with it, happy to work with some of the young upstarts that gave the pipe and slippers music scene a much needed boot up the backside.

Leaving EMI in the early 80's, David went freelance and began a long professional partnership with fellow designer Ken Ansell. Under the oft-used pseudonym, Bitter & Twisted, they produced covers for Virgin Records, including Swindon's very own, XTC, Sheffield electro wizards, The Human League and the Birmingham reggae boys, UB40.

In 1983 David and Ken were founder members of Clinic, which went on to employ over 50 people. Clinic was a pioneer in the new wave of companies that broke down the traditionally separate roles of design and advertising by combining them. It brought its pop culture roots into the work produced for Virgin Atlantic, Virgin Megastores, Sky, ITV and Barclays. Even Network Rail was given a dose of the rock and roll treatment.

It's no surprise then that since David gave up the day job, his work as a painter and occasional printmaker still has more than just a shot of rhythm and blues.

#### Surrey Hills 'Surrey Unearthed'

**'S**urrey Unearthed' is an Arts Council England funded project that focuses on the natural materials of the Surrey Hills landscape, their history and uses over time. Ten artists are researching & developing new work in response to their chosen material in the form of an outdoor installation, art walks and community celebration to coincide with the 60th year AONB designation. Projects include an illuminated large-scale earth work on farmland beneath Box Hill (as shown in photo), an art documentary at the sand guarries in East Surrey and a permanent structure at a viewpoint on Farnham Heath. **Nick Wyschna** is very much a Guildford boy. Born at St. Luke's, schooled at Onslow First, Queen Eleanor's, Guildford County and Guildford College before going to drama school at the Royal Academy of Music in London. Nick grew up in Onslow Village where his mum still lives and he now lives in Burpham.

Nick came to the arts quite late compared to most. It wasn't until he was about 14 when he realised there was 'something in this!'. When told, at Guildford County School, that he either had to play something or sing something for the music exam he had little choice. He found a tape cassette backing track with 'Groovy Kind of Love' on one side and 'Careless Whisper' on the other and chose to perform the George Michael classic.

It couldn't have gone too badly as head of music, and now good friend, *Caroline Gale* saw something and took him under her wing. The rest is history, but from then on Nick's life was surrounded by music and theatre.

Nick set up **Guildford Fringe** which now includes **Guildford Fringe Theatre Company** (runs all year and produces plays, musicals, cabarets and Adult Panto's), **Guildford Fringe Festival** (Guildford's open-access, multi-arts Festival) and **Guildford Fringe Performing Arts** (stage school for 7-12 year olds). It all started in 2012, and has gone from strength to strength with all aspects of the business growing each year. **Gag House Comedy Clubs** was also formed through *Guildford Fringe* but now sees Nick and his comedy clubs in Reigate, Godalming, Dartford, London and Watford as well as his two monthly clubs in Guildford.

Nick loves the arts, and loves Guildford, and gets involved with everything that includes entertainment in the town, including *Surrey County Show, Christmas Lights Switch On* and the *Experience Guildford Customer Service Awards*. He also hosts regular free networking events for local artists, producers, groups and arts lovers to get together to discuss what is happening in the town with the view to getting more people working together.

This year Nick set up, along with his brother, sister and mum, **The Wysch Foundation**. This is a registered charity which will work towards making the arts accessible to more in Guildford. One of their projects includes paying for families, who may not be able to afford such luxuries, to go to the theatre so they can enjoy a night out and benefit from the arts as a family.

# 'Art & Soul' in Haslemere!



Local artist, David Paynter, who operates under the banner of The Artful Gallery, is hosting 21 award-winning artists at his studio and six acres of grounds in Haslemere in June. Over 100 works will be on show, including paintings, drawings, ceramics, glass, metals and a sculpture trail around the beautiful gardens and woodland of his 'Huf' house on Marley Common.

This is the seventh year David has staged the exhibition, in conjunction with Surrey Artists Open Studios. He commented:

"Art & Soul has become quite a fixture. Hundreds of people visit us during the show, some from many miles away, to enjoy the eclectic mix of painters and sculptors, all highly respected in their fields. The gardens are becoming quite an attraction in themselves thanks to the hard work of my wife, Lynn. Once again I am excited by the prospect of designing a show that will please the eye and the soul."

David is a poet as well as an artist. His sculptural work ranges from semi-abstract human figures to animals and abstract forms. Many of his pieces are accompanied by a poem, adding another dimension to the work. Two of David's sculptures, with their poems, have pride of place at Farnham Road Mental Health hospital in Guildford. David also produces spontaneous, vibrant life drawings.



The array of painters featured cover virtually all subjects from abstract works through to striking portraits. The sculpture trail is always a popular feature of the show, especially on warm sunny days. The sweeping lawns and the woodland walk around David's house will feature sculptures in a variety of materials.

This year, for the first time at *Art & Soul*, there will be live demonstrations of sculptural techniques given by the well-known animal sculptor, Carol Orwin.
