
#### Hello Everyone



Festival of the Arts - 25th - 28th September 2025

Guildford Festival of the Arts is a four-day celebration of the visual arts, designed to showcase the talent of local artists and engage the community in creative experiences. Taking place in Guildford Town Centre, the event aims to rejuvenate the local art scene by utilising independent shops, arts venues and other creative spaces. The festival will provide a unique opportunity for residents and visitors to interact with artists, explore various artistic disciplines, and participate in collaborative projects.

#### What to Expect:

- Art Exhibitions & Pop-Up Installations: Established arts venues as well as other
  well known spaces around the town centre will feature work from local artists, including
  students, charities as well as giving opportunities to the public to submit to our open
- Workshops & Talks: Opportunities for all ages to participate in hands-on arts workshops and engage in discussions led by local creatives.
- Community Art Project: A collaborative heritage project where residents contribute to build a sculpture celebrating Guildford's cultural history.
- Walking Tour & Stamp Trail: Visitors collect stamps at different art locations, with
  potential incentives like free drinks or souvenirs at participating venues.

Who is Involved? The event will collaborate with local art organizations such as Guildford Arts, Lockwood Studios, New House Art Space, Art+Grind, Yvonne Arnaud, G-Live and more. Other venues will host activities and exhibitions. Schools, universities, and art charities will also be invited to participate and showcase the wonderful work that they do.

Why It Matters: Guildford Festival of the Arts seeks to revitalise existing arts spaces and introduce new audiences to the richness of the local visual arts scene. By engaging businesses, artists, and the public, the festival aims to leave a lasting impact, making art more accessible and appreciated in everyday life. It also serves as a platform for emerging artists to gain exposure, while fostering a sense of community through shared cultural experiences. The event aspires to establish Guildford as a hub for the arts, attracting visitors and strengthening

## Summer at the Yvonne Arnaud Theatre


This summer the Yvonne Arnaud theatre and Guildford Shakespeare Company are working on a co-production of *The Comedy of Errors* and *A Company of Rascals* 

Shakespeare's farcical rollercoaster of a tale tells of two sets of identical twins, full of slapstick and mistaken identity. *The Comedy of Errors* is Shakespeare's shortest play with wives, debtors, officers, friends and even the twins themselves caught up in a confection of slapstick and confusion.

It is performed in tandem with a hilarious brand-new comedy by Phil Porter *A Company of Rascals*, set in the bawdy backstreets of Ephesus, a world of charlatans and bootleggers, exploring the story behind the story of Shakespeare's comic characters.

Both plays are performed by one incredible cast, cleverly intertwining the action, as they move from the main stage for *The Comedy of Errors* to locations around the theatre for *A Company of Rascals*. Timing will be everything.

In a jam packed summer season, there's also the highly anticipated drama, *By Royal Appointment*, a funny, poignant and celebratory new play about the kind of power that only a Queen can wield – she charms the world through coats and admonishes her family through a carefully chosen hat. Or if you fancy a regency murder mystery then *Death Comes to Pemberley* tours to the theatre in August. Six years after Elizabeth Bennet and Mr. Darcy's happy union, their idyllic life at Pemberley is shattered when a man is murdered in the woods. As the investigation unfolds, dark secrets emerge, tensions rise, and loyalties are tested.



For all the family *The Singing Mermaid* by **Julia Donaldson** with songs by **Barb Jungr** is the perfect summer treat.





The Guildford Institute's What's On programme is packed full of events to see you through summer and beyond. These include a variety of practical art and craft courses, fascinating art history lectures and live music events.
